The History of Perl

Perl 1.0

- Perl 1.0 Dec 1987
- Written by Larry Wall
- "Diagonal" Language
- Text processing
- Network programming
- Borrowed ideas from C, awk, sed, shell, etc.

Early Perl Versions

- Perl 2.0 Jun 1988
 - Introduced regular expressions
- Perl 3.0 Oct 1989
 - Introduced ability to handle binary data
- Perl 4.0 Mar 1991
 - Introduced the Camel book :-)

Perl 5

- Released Oct 1994
- "introduced everything else, including the ability to introduce everything else" - Larry Wall
- Modules, references and objects
- Regular maintenance and enhancement releases
- Current version 5.8.3 Jan 2004
- Also ongoing maintenance on 5.5.x and 5.6.x

Lazy boolean evaluation

```
open FILE, $somefile or die $!;
```

Statement modifiers

```
print "DEBUG: $var" if $debug;
```

Implicit variables

```
while (<FILE>) {
    # record in $_
}
```

Putting them together...

```
open FILE, $somefile of die $!;
while (<FILE>) {
   print if /$search_string/;
}
```
